### **NSW Carers Register**



### The NSW Carers Register


- The Carers Register is a secure, restricted access database which holds information about authorised carers, individuals who apply to become authorised carers, and their household members
- The system has been developed by the Office of the Children's Guardian to promote the safety, welfare and wellbeing of children and young people in statutory and supported outof-home care.

### Aim of the Carers Register



- To improve the appropriate authorisation of carers in NSW, by licensing carers after all required probity and suitability checks are completed and by supporting effective interagency information exchange about carer applicants, authorised carers, and their household members.
- 2. The Carers Register will provide a common resource that all agencies must use to share information about carer applicants, carers and their household members.
- 3. A carer de-authorised by one agency will not be able to present at another organisation without the two agencies discussing the person's suitability to be a carer.

# Guiding principles



The Carers Register will record essential information only and operate as a restricted access site subject to strict privacy controls.

It will reduce the risk of inappropriate authorisation of carers by:

- Requiring agencies to certify that statutory and supported carers, and relevant household members, have undergone minimum probity and suitability checks
- Acting as a licensing tool by issuing an individual with a carer authorisation number, without which a person may not provide statutory or supported care.

# What the Carers Register will not do



### What the Carers Register will not do:

- · Record details of children in care
- Support placement matching
- Replace designated agencies' more detailed processes and systems for assessment and authorisation of carers and their households
- Contain detailed records
- Record details of carers who are not authorised by designated agencies
- Record details of carers who do not provide care in a private capacity e.g. staff in residential care

# **Aggregated Data**



The Carers Register will be a reliable source of aggregated data including:

- application and authorisation history, including application refusal and cancellation or suspension of an authorisation
- associations between carers and households (including individual household members) and movements into and out of households
- any historical or current associations between carer applicants, carers and their household members and designated agencies
- consolidated reports detailing households and associated carer application/authorisation history


# Flags and Alerts



Information recorded in the Carers Register will:

- flag potential concerns relating to carer applicants, carers and their household members
- provide alerts to designated agencies to follow up and seek further information from other designated agencies

### **Carers Register Process**



Here is an overview of how the Carers Register works.

- 1. The Carers Register is a secure, restricted access database.
  - A designated agency registers with OCG to access the Carers Register.
  - The OCG processes the application and provides the agency with secure access details.
  - The designated agency may then create additional users.

### 2. Recording the details of carer applicants, carers and their household members

- Designated agencies are prompted to search for individuals in the system before entering details
- The system will flag the outcomes of carer applications, surrendered/suspended/ cancelled authorisations and certain reportable allegations and conduct involving carers
- Designated agencies must certify completion of minimum probity and suitability checks
- Emergency authorisations are provisional and deemed to be an application for full authorisation

### 3. Carer authorisation approved or refused

- A designated agency may grant (or refuse) an application for authorisation
- The system will issue a carer authorisation number, licensing an individual to provide statutory or supported OOHC.

### 4. Information sharing

• The Carers Register is a common resource that all agencies must use to share information about carers, carer applicants and their household members.
