

Child Safe checklist

for parents and carers

Use this checklist when you visit a child-related organisation to find out how safe it is for your child. You can record your observations and save it for future reference.

Things to look for:

- Have you seen anything on the organisation's social media or website that says the organisation puts child safety first?
- Can you see any posters that describe child safety?
- Can you see staff being respectful of children when they interact with them?
- Are there spaces where adults can be alone with children unsupervised? How are adults supervised in these spaces?
- If there's a changing room, who is allowed in there and how is changing supervised?

Questions to ask:

- Do you verify the Working with Children Checks of all your child-related workers?
 - Do you do this by going to the Office of the Children's Guardian (OCG) website?
- Do you have a:
 - Child Safe Policy?
 - Child Safe Code of Conduct?
 - Child Safe Reporting Policy?
- Have your staff completed child safety training, such as the OCG's eLearning?
- Have children older than 3 had protective behaviours training (i.e. a personal safety program), such as the OCG's SAFE Series protective behaviours program?
- How can parents raise concerns with the organisation?
- How are children encouraged to speak up if they feel unsafe?
- How can parents be involved with the organisation, such as annual reviews of policies and procedures?
- How are vulnerable children, such as children with disabilities, supported?
- How are children from other cultures supported?
- How are their families supported to be involved with the organisation?
- In educational settings, what is the staff to child ratio?
